

## STRENGTHENING PHILANTHROPY IN CANADA

Canada's charitable sector is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest in the world with 170,000 non-profits/charities employing 2 million people and representing 11.1% of the workforce. The sector represents \$106 billion or 8.1% of the GDP (larger than the automotive or manufacturing industries). AFP Canada is the preeminent governing body for more than 3,600 fundraising professionals across 20 chapters in Canada.

## **DIVERSITY & INCLUSION TRAINING**

The AFP Fellowship in Inclusion & Philanthropy program will train diverse fundraisers from across the country in ethical fundraising and inclusion best practices to ensure the sector's future leaders reflect Canada's ethnic, cultural and linguistic diversity. ## **SECTOR RESEARCH**

A leading-edge research agenda to build the body of knowledge on fundraising practice and philanthropy in Canada; this includes an annual research grants program and the seminal biennial donor survey – *What Canadian Donors Want*. In 2020, the Fundraising Effectiveness Project will come to Canada measuring annual growth in giving.
